

Pleasingly, we can report that 2021 was a slightly better year for community football in the region than the last. The opportunity to return to play was embraced by all.

As an organisation, we have continued to cement our position as an enabler and supporter of community Australian Rules Football throughout Western Victoria and I am pleased to present to you a few key areas of performance and achievement as follows.











### STAFFING

As part of our continued work to narrow our focus on the support of community football and to shift away from football operations, we said farewell to both Mike Farrow (Senior Operations Coordinator) and Bel Jones (Operations Coordinator).

Mike transitioned into the employment of the Hampden Football Netball League as League Administrator and we are thankful to Mike for his ongoing contributions to football in the region.

After a stint in supporting the marketing needs of AFL Victoria, Bel moved to Sydney and has continued her work in the marketing space, now with Cancer Council NSW. Bel's contribution to our team should not be underestimated as communications to our stakeholders with relevant COVID information was of critical importance which she supported.

We welcomed into our team Isobel Upfal and Edgar Guerrero, both in the position of Game Development Officers. Both Isobel and Eddie have done a marvellous job in running various clinics in both the community and schools since they commenced. Playing to their strengths, they have been particularly valued in what they have done to increase the awareness and participation in our game amongst the female and multicultural segments.

Due to a restructure of AFL Victoria, the role of Regional Manager of AFL Western District will now grow to encompass AFL Goldfields. Whilst having an opportunity to apply and pursue roles in the new structure, I have elected to take a redundancy to pursue other business interests and will finish on 28 March 2022 as Regional Manager. TWe welcome incoming Regional Manager of AFL Western District & AFL Goldfields, Jason Muldoon. Jason is no stranger to the area, having been the immediate past Regional Manager of AFL Wimmera Mallee and I wish him continued success.

We also farewell Jock Whiting, Football Development Manager - South West Region, who has also elected not to pursue further opportunities within AFL Victoria at this stage. Jock has had a distinguished career in community football in our region for over 20 years. Whilst Jock is looking forward to pursuing some recreation, I have no doubt he will be no stranger to football in coming years and will still maintain his involvement in other ways.



### Football Governance

Some changes were implemented throughout the year to the governance of football and leagues.

The Advisory Board as established in 2020, has continued to guide and govern the regions various policies and procedures. We thank the Advisory Board members for their time and contribution to these important roles.

We worked with the clubs of the South West District Football Netball League to reform the league as an independent incorporated body, empowering the group to self-govern and run their own competition. Thanks to the SWDFNL for their collaboration in this transition.



### **Participation**

The participation figures dramatically changed from 2020 to 2021. Whilst only 1,100 players managed to play a game last year, we had 4,975 players take to the field in 2021. We have often used 2019 as a comparative year which saw 5,104 players play a match. These figures demonstrate the strength and bounce back of community football in the region and it is a remarkable achievement to come within 3% of 2019 participation numbers.

Continuance of the Club Champion program reaching 16 of 40 clubs in the region,

Continued collaboration with various stakeholder groups in region – working together on the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.

A renewal into the second year of the region-wide partnership with The Midfield Group. In 2021, all 40 clubs received customised COVID-19 signage packs and the junior support fund continued.

Junior Support Fund concept continued with another 50 deserving junior participants supported with equipment and apparel vouchers to Sportspower.

Outside the Locker Room sessions facilitated with the Great South Cost Suicide Prevention group to 10 clubs.

AFL Western District website development completed and launched hosing various resources and information for the region.

Strong regional advocacy provided leading to the announcement of a major \$250,000 investment from the AFL Facilities Fund into the Reid Oval, Warrnambool.



### **Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The directors have prepared the financial report on the basis that the company is a non-reporting entity because there are no users who are dependent on its general purpose financial statements. This financial report is therefore a special purpose financial statements that has been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the mandatory Australian Accounting Standards applicable under the Corporations Act 2001 and the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the directors have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, with the exception of the cash flow statement, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. The amount presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period, unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### **Accounts Receivable and Other Receivables**

Accounts receivable are recognised initially at the transaction price (i.e. cost) and are subsequently measured at cost less provision for impairment. Receivables are expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of the accounts receivable and other receivables are reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that the amounts are not recoverable. If so, an impairment loss is recognised immediately in the statement of income and expenditure.

Intercompany balance with AFL Victoria represents the cash held by AFL Victoria on behalf of the company at balance date.

#### Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Cont)

#### **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liabilities at the end of the reporting period for the goods and services recieved by the company that remain unpaid.

Accounts payable are recognised at their transaction price. Accounts payable are obligations on the basis of normal credit terms.

#### **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating the the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

#### Property, Plant and Equipment

Note 2: Trade and other debtors

Income received in advance

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

#### Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may not satisfy vesting requirements. Those cash outflows are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cash flows.

### **Income Tax**

No provision for income tax has been raised as the organisation is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act* 1997.
